
Key Stage 3
























The Glens


















Residential




5 - A must for all karate enthusiasts. Look out for sessions returning to Derby. Thankyou John Johnston and the team at Adaptive Karate.

Free Holiday Activities


Did you know that if your child receives benefits-related free school meals, they are entitled to FREE holiday activities over the summer holidays? Holiday clubs are available across Derby

Apply Now for September School Transport

A reminder to parents; if your child is moving up to Post 16 education in September (Year 11, 12 and 13) please complete your child's home to school transport application as soon as possible

At St Andrew's Academy, most of our students are dropped off and collected from school via mini bus or taxi. These services are provided and arranged independently by Derby City Council or your child's Local Authority (if outside of the City Council). **If your child will be moving up to post-16 education**, now is the time to apply.

Remember to attach any required evidence (for example; benefit entitlement or medical/SEND documentation.
