
This week, it's my honour to share Erin's organ donor story with you and the immeasurable impact and enormous sense of pride we all feel that Erin went on to save others.

The Highlands










Jura Class had a fantastic learning experience this week, combining both maths and functional life skills to make cookies for our pudding. The pupils worked together to gather the ingredients and, with support, measured out the correct quantities, practising their number skills. We followed the recipe step by step, taking turns to add ingredients and mix them together, encouraging turn-taking, communication, and teamwork.

The mixture smelled wonderful as it was prepared! With support, pupils placed the cookies into the oven and set a timer, developing their awareness of sequencing and time. Everyone listened carefully for the timer before staff took the cookies out to cool. Finally, pupils sampled a small piece to taste their hard work, before storing the rest safely in a container, ready to enjoy for pudding the following day.

In Taransay this week we have been looking at Yorkshire pudding day measuring ingredients to make our very own Yorkshire pudding pizzas. Each student made their own Yorkshire pudding pizza and they all really enjoyed it.


Therapy Input






Makaton- Sign of the Week
