







Highlands

We also started to look at how we can develop Student Voice next year.


The students said, having the sessions longer and more often, meeting different classes to show what we are doing.

In our extra curricular creative arts after school club the students have been working on making their own scratch art. All students did there own designs. The students work is being showcased in our school art gallery.


