Key Stage 3









Key Stage 4

This session really helped us develop our critical thinking skills.


Our summer fair is fast approaching . If you can join us on 28th June please do so, we guarantee there to be lots of fun!

Thanks in advance the students have been busy with ideas of their own stalls. The class that makes the most money will win a prize and certificate for all.


We are also hosting a Dragons Den style pitch for the pupils to share their ideas and skills with a board of Employers. This is brand new and super exciting!


