Our core purpose is to enable young people to become content, fulfilled citizens in society through improved independence, effectively accessing the world around them with purpose and independent. A key component of our curriculum offer throughout the entire school is to educate pupil off site, providing real life opportunities and purposeful experiences to prepare our young people for adulthood. Last year, we had 1 9-seater people carrier to contribute to public transport and expensive private hire to enable young people to learn off the school site. Today, we still have that 1 9 seat people carrier, we also have 2 X 9-seater electric people carriers and a 17-seater minibus. This investment has made a significant impact on further opening up the world and widening pupil horizons.

We remain fully committed to a constant reflection and evolution of our curriculum offer to further excite and engage our young people. Please do check in with your young person to find out where they have been and what they have learning to find out more.







The Glens

Fair Isle Class-We have been learning about light in our science topic . Students engaged in an experiment to create shadows using hands and objects. We are having a lot of fun working on our experiments!

Music Therapy- Students engage in music therapy sessions with music therapist once a week. This gives them the opportunity to build on turn taking skills, choose instruments to play, and listen to others music as a group.









This half term, Skye Class have been enjoying their food technology lessons. They have been making beans on toast; putting the bread in the toaster with adult support and buttering their own toast. The students have been using their empathy and self awareness skills.





In Mull class students have been learning about different technologies in school. We have focussed on taking photos and printing them out. Students have then written about these photos in their learning for life writing books, linking their ICT and writing activities together.

Some of the students in KS4 have been visiting St Martins each week to learn the steel band. We will be doing a performance next week for KS3 students at St Martins.








Key Stage 5




















Residential Department


