WHAT IS HAF?

The holiday activities and food (HAF) programme aims to provide support for families in Derby by providing free activities and meals during school holidays. The fund aims to achieve the following for children and young people:

- access to enriching activities that they may not otherwise be able to attend
- enjoy learning new skills
- meeting friends and socialising, reducing social isolation during school holidays
- have a healthy and nutritious meal
- take part in physical and creative activities
- build greater knowledge of health and nutrition.

This particular HAF club will be for St Andrews students only, those who currently receive free school meals

WHO IS RUNNING THE HAF CLUB?

St Andrews staff will be running the club throughout the Summer holidays; specific staff members will be confirmed in due course and a welcome pack issued to families with names and photos of staff working with their young person.

WHERE IS THE HAF CLUB?

The club will be delivered on the main school site as this allows access to facilities such as food technology room, sensory spaces and the playground. Students may attend activities off site during the day; this will be communicated directly with parents/carers.





WHAT DAYS AND TIMES WILL THE HAF RUN?

The HAF summer dates:

- Tuesday 28th July 9-3 (Drayton Manor Day)
- Wednesday 29th July 10-2 (cycling and arts and crafts- onsite)
- Tuesday 18th August 9-3 (Carsington)
- Wednesday 19th August 10-2 (Sports day- onsite),
- Tuesday 25th August 9-3 (Lea Green- onsite)
- Wednesday 26th August (beach party).

WHAT WILL STUDENTS BE DOING AT HAF?



Students will be provided a nutritious meal in line with school meal guidance and, where appropriate, will be included in the preparation and cooking of the meal. Activities will be planned appropriate to the students in attendance, specific timetables will be issued in the welcome pack.

HOW TO BOOK HAF:

There are a total of 15 funded places and a total of 5 paid places each day- parents will need to complete the relevant booking form using the QR codes below. By completing the booking form, they are not automatically allocated their chosen days- they will be contacted directly with confirmation of days and times etc. Paid places will cost £40 per day per student

Places are also open to our new students who are due to start with us in September.

Limited transport options may be available- this needs to be discussed with Jessica Johnston (Assistant Headteacher) via the school office. Welcome packs will be issued nearer the time with symbol timetables, photos of staff and locations etc.

WHAT DO I NEED TO DO ABOUT HAF?

1. Complete the relevant booking form using the QR code
2. If you are in receipt of income based free school meals- watch for an email or text message prompting you to claim your HAF vouchers. Make a note of your voucher code and share with us as soon as possible. St Andrews will complete the booking on your behalf but will need the voucher codes in order to do this.
3. If you are allocated a paid place- watch email or text message confirming place and details on how to pay
4. An email confirmation will be sent to you confirming your placement at the HAF club.

Many children with SEN thrive on routine, structure, and predictability. School provides a familiar environment and daily schedule that helps them feel safe and secure. A long break from this routine can sometimes lead to feelings of uncertainty, anxiety, or difficulty adjusting to the changes that the summer holidays bring.

As parents and carers, we recognise that this transition can be challenging not only for children but for families too. Every child experiences change differently, and what works for one child may not work for another.

To help make the transition as smooth as possible, we have put together a guide containing practical ideas, helpful strategies, and tips that may support your child in preparing for the end

of the school term, managing the summer break, and settling back into school when the new term begins.

We hope these suggestions provide reassurance and support during the holiday period, helping your child feel more confident and comfortable with the changes ahead.

Community Short Breaks

Community Short Breaks Service Consultation

Community Short Breaks are designed for children and young people aged 0–17 with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) who require additional support to participate in activities. Providers deliver targeted* services by organising inclusive activities and offering the necessary support to enable participation. These activities may take place after school, at weekends, or during school holidays.

In addition to supporting children and young people, Community Short Breaks provide valuable respite for families by giving parents and carers time away from their caring responsibilities.

*Targeted services are intended for children and young people who may require additional support and, in some cases, an assessment of need to access provision.

Public Consultation

Derby City Council launched a public consultation on the Community Short Breaks Service on **21 May 2026**. The consultation will run for 90 days and will close at midnight on **19 August 2026**.

As part of an ongoing review of the service, Derby City Council is proposing several potential changes. We are seeking feedback from parents and carers, children and young people, and service providers. Your views will help us better understand both the potential impact of the proposed changes and perspectives on the current Community Short Breaks offer.

The consultation will include:

- Face-to-face focus groups (further details will be shared shortly)
- Surveys for parents and carers, children and young people, and providers

We are keen to engage with as many individuals as possible and would greatly appreciate your support in sharing the survey link widely across your networks.

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Home to School Travel Service- A message from Derby City Council



Home to School Travel Service School/College Newsletter – March 2026

Hello!

Welcome everybody to the Home to School Travel Service Newsletter.

It's March already, and we are in full swing with planning for the September 2026 intake!

Our application window opens soon, so please encourage all parents to complete their applications during this window to allow us sufficient time to plan routes etc., ready for September. Please see below details of who will need to apply/re-apply.

Applications for Travel Assistance for 2026-2027

The on-line application for travel assistance for 2026-2027 opens on 01 April 2026.
Applications received before this date, will be automatically refused.

Who needs to apply?

A new application must be completed if any of the bullet points below apply:

- ❖ Family is applying for travel assistance for a child for the first time.
- ❖ A child is starting school in Reception class in September 2026.
- ❖ A child is starting a new school in September 2026.
- ❖ A child is moving into Year 3 in September 2026 (Infant to Junior Schools only).
- ❖ A child is moving into Year 7 in September 2026.
- ❖ A child is moving into Year 12 in September 2026 (e.g., sixth form or college).
- ❖ A student is currently in post 16 or post 19 education and will be continuing in education in September 2026 (post 16 learners and adult learners must apply every year).
- ❖ Applying for a bus pass for a child for academic year 2026-27.

❖ Moving to a new home address before September 2026.

Please note: If none of the above apply, and a child already receives travel assistance, this will remain in place for academic year 2026-27.

How to apply?

The on-line application window is open between 01 April 2026 and 31 May 2026. Families can apply by using the link below. If an application is received after 31 May 2026, it will still be processed, but travel assistance arrangements may not be in place for the start of the autumn term. If a student wishes to apply for travel assistance, independently of a parent or carer, they must be age 18 or over.

Supporting documents e.g., Education, Health, and Care Plan (EHCP), medical evidence, proof of free school meals, proof of baptism will need to be included with the application.

Families who do not have access to the Internet should visit a local library or the Council House for free computer and Internet access to complete the online application.

Please note: Responses provided on the online application form MUST be in relation to the school that a child will be attending from September 2026.

Mileage Allowance and Post -16 Personal Travel Budgets Update:

The summer term payment is due to be paid to parents during Easter 2026. Email requests for attendance data have already been sent to schools. Due to the way Easter falls and the Council's financial closedown, please provide the attendance data for the spring term by no later than 11 March 2026.

Detentions:

We have had some recent experience of students who are on Council Organised Transport receiving after school detentions. If school is giving this sanction, they must contact the transport provider and cancel the transport as the crews cannot wait until the detention is over. The responsibility for collecting a child following after school detention is with the parent/carer.

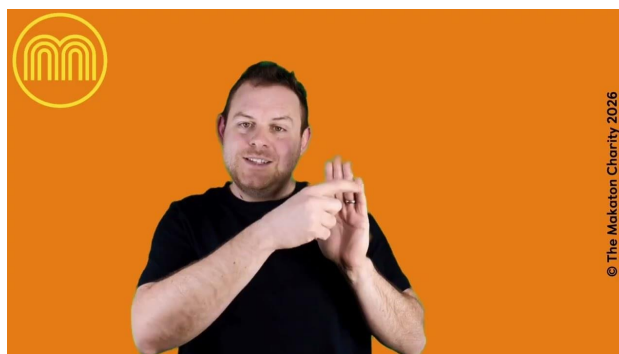

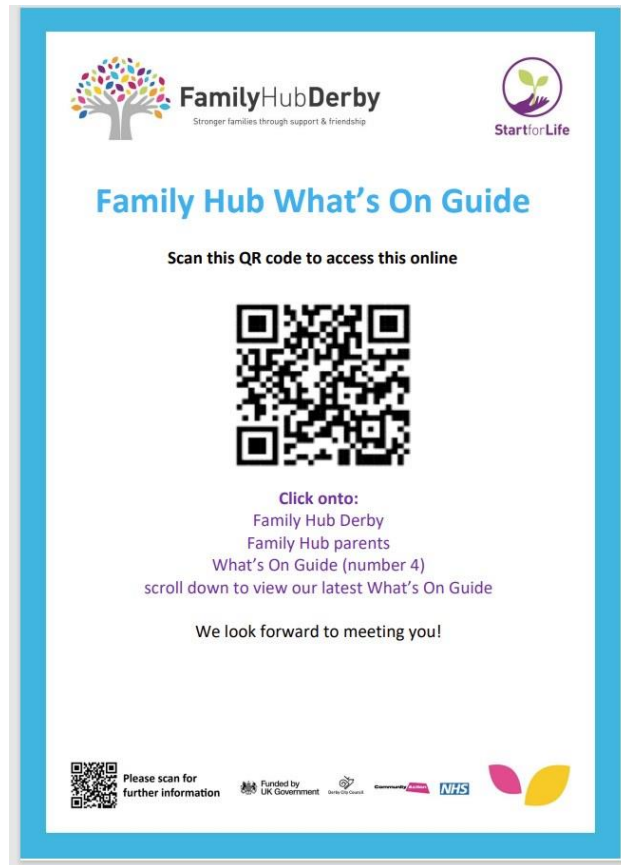
