A message from Derbyshire Immunisation Service-Upcoming Year 9 vaccinations

Dear Parents/ Carers

Tetanus, Diphtheria & Polio (Td/IPV) & Meningitis ACWY Immunisations are due to take place at your school on **Friday 27th February 2026**. These vaccines are free of charge.

Most children have been immunised against Tetanus, Diphtheria & Polio and Meningitis C as part of the childhood UK schedule. Guidance from NHS England recommends that your child now receives a booster dose of Tetanus, Diphtheria & Polio and Meningitis ACWY.

Please complete the link below to give consent for the vaccinations, this will close on **13th February 2026**. If you do not wish your child to have the immunisations, you can complete a refusal via the same link.

Please be aware that if we do not receive either a completed consent form or a refusal, each young person will be individually assessed by a healthcare professional to self-consent on the day. If they are deemed Gillick competent, they may be offered the vaccination.

A group of students from campus have begun attending the Feel Alive Hub on Mondays as part of their Developing Community Independence learning. The Feel Alive Hub is a social provision that provides activities and support for young people who are no longer in full time education and is attended by a number of our Alumni. Students are utilising the public bus to travel to and

from the Feel Alive Hub and taking part in activities within the centre. They are also provided with a meal prepared by users of the hub and have been very positive with their feedback so far!





Key Stage 3

This half term in Orkney class so far, we have been learning about Nelson Mandela and the continent Africa. We have been completing our sensory story and reading about his upbringing and how he changed so many lives!

We have also been going out on the mini bus to the supermarket. We have been to Aldi, Asda and B&M. The children have been learning about cleaning products and finding the right products in the shop to buy when cleaning. When in Aldi and Asda we have also bought meal prep ingredients, giving each individual the opportunity to explore the supermarket with staff supervision, picking out the correct ingredients from the shopping list. They then take it in turns to scan and shop or give their shopping to the supermarket staff and practise their life skills!









The Glens



This week Glen Nevis students had fantastic fun exploring the gym equipment in the hall. They used the chest press, bicep curl machine, and treadmill. Students were able to take part in gross motor exploration, experimenting with whole-body movements at their own pace. We also saw lovely moments of motor initiation, with several students beginning movements independently, especially when motivated by music. It has been wonderful to see growing confidence, strength, and joyful engagement throughout the sessions!



Therapy Input



The students take part in a wide variety of hand-strengthening activities that go beyond fine motor work at a table, ensuring they develop strength in a functional and engaging way. Alongside targeted fine motor tasks, students practise weight-bearing activities that encourage them to support their body weight through their hands and wrists, which is essential for building stability and endurance. This includes exercises using therapy balls and bean bags, where students push, reach, balance, and hold positions that strengthen the hands, wrists, arms, and shoulders. Activities are often play-based and movement-focused, allowing students to develop hand strength through whole-body involvement while also improving coordination, core strength, and body awareness. All exercises are carefully adapted to meet individual needs and are embedded into meaningful, motivating activities.

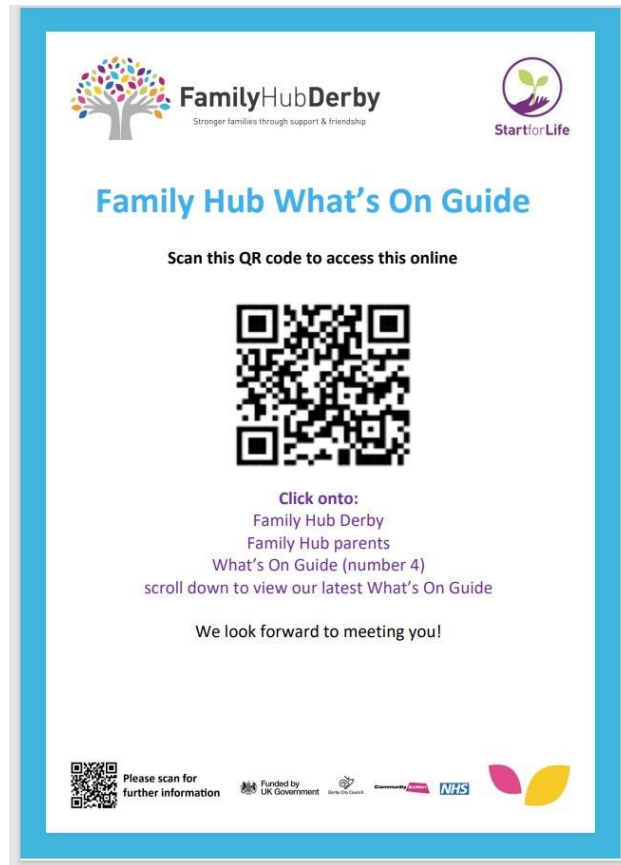
