A message from Derbyshire Immunisation Service-Upcoming Year 9 vaccinations

Dear Parents/ Carers

Tetanus, Diphtheria & Polio (Td/IPV) & Meningitis ACWY Immunisations are due to take place at your school on **Friday 27th February 2026**. These vaccines are free of charge.

Most children have been immunised against Tetanus, Diphtheria & Polio and Meningitis C as part of the childhood UK schedule. Guidance from NHS England recommends that your child now receives a booster dose of Tetanus, Diphtheria & Polio and Meningitis ACWY.

Please complete the link below to give consent for the vaccinations, this will close on 13th February 2026. If you do not wish your child to have the immunisations, you can complete a refusal via the same link.

Please be aware that if we do not receive either a completed consent form or a refusal, each young person will be individually assessed by a healthcare professional to self-consent on the day. If they are deemed Gillick competent, they may be offered the vaccination.

If your child is outstanding their MMR vaccination and you would like for them to receive this vaccination, please contact our office on the details below.



KS4




The Highlands

Therapy Input



A textured walkway is a valuable tool for supporting sensory integration and proprioception, as it provides rich tactile and deep-pressure input through the feet and lower limbs. Walking across varied surfaces helps the nervous system process and organise sensory information, improving body awareness, balance, and motor planning. The changing textures encourage children to adjust their posture and movement, strengthening proprioceptive feedback about where their body is in space. This can support regulation, coordination, and confidence in movement, particularly for children who seek or avoid sensory input.

Despite a very wet and windy week, progress continues on developing the Whitaker Road site and students have been busy assisting with moving and building planters and sweeping away dirt and leaves to get the outside spaces ready for sunnier weather (fingers crossed this will come soon!). school alumni. The students (and staff!) have certainly enjoyed sneaking a bit of chocolate for themselves too!




