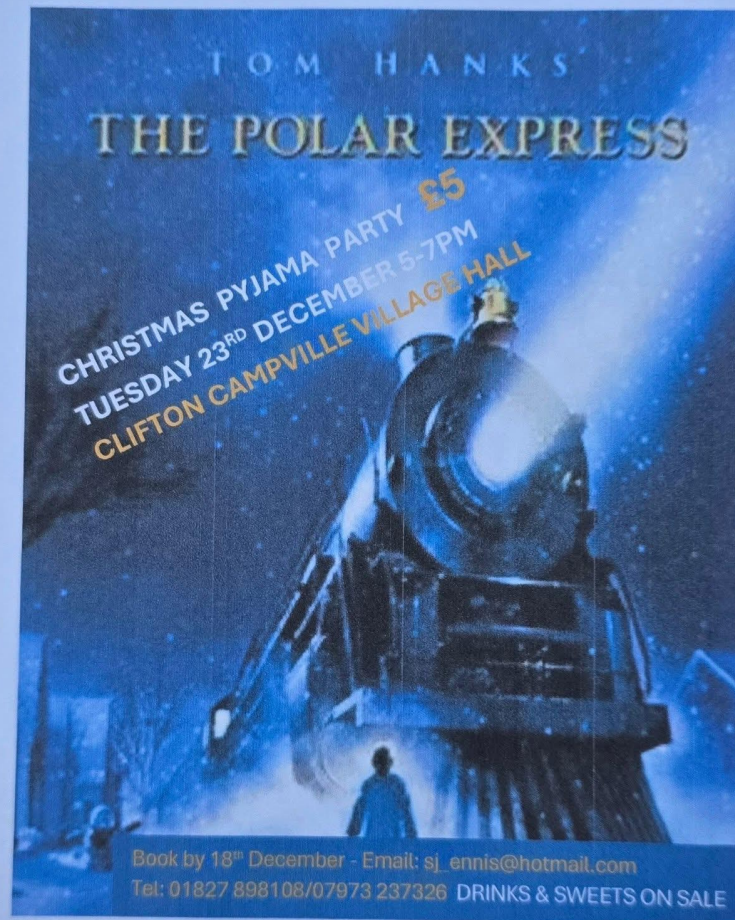


POLAR EXPRESS PJ PARTY – TUESDAY 23rd DECEMBER 5-7PM

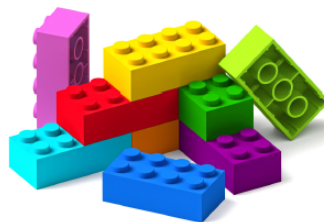
