You can also click '2Dos' for any new set. If you click on 'Work', then use the arrow drop-downs to select your class, then you can find your own folder where you can save things, your completed 2Dos, and a weekly folder where extra resources can be saved (for example maths activity sheets which used to be found on White Rose). Weekly Maths Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)

- Watch a Numberblocks clip each day at: <u>BBC</u> or <u>CBeebies</u>. Use this guide <u>here</u> to give you ideas on what to do with your children whilst watching an episode.
- Watch a clip each day. The theme is <u>Alive in 5! - Week 3 | White Rose Maths</u> Then complete the daily activities
- Go outside and find 3 worms. Remember to treat them with care! Use string and cut each piece of string the same length as each worm. This will be a challenge! Which is the longest.....? EXT: Use a ruler and measure each piece of string. Use the ruler like a number line. Can you read and write the numbers?

Weekly Reading Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)

- Find a variety of books at home. Look at the front cover and talk about what can be seen. Does it have illustrations or photographs? Is it fiction or non-fiction? Justify. Open the book. Is there a Contents page? What does this do? Choose a section to read together.
- Reception age children: Children to read to parents daily. Visit Oxford Owl for free eBooks that link to your child's book band. You can create a free account.
 - Complete the linked play activities for each book.
- Visit this free site and read the books. <u>Learn to Read</u> with Phonics | Starfall Education
- Go to the Purple Mash 'Cloze procedure' in the 2Dos. Learn to read 'the.'

- Use pan scales when you play on the free interactive game <u>Happy Camel</u>. <u>Games.peg + cat | PBS KIDS</u>
- Make a tower using 10 Lego bricks. Can you find something taller/ shorter or equal to the height of your tower?
 EXT: Record what you have found and write the height of the object.
- Find a ruler. Roll out some playdough and cut it into a length that is 5cm. Can you now cut a longer piece and a shorter piece of dough?
 EXT: Draw and write the length of the dough. Remember to use the ruler as a number line.
- Make a trail of cards with words 'I, no, go, to, the, into, he, she, we, be'. 'you' on each card and turn them into a game. Who can get the furthest with reading out all the words correctly!
 - To mix this activity up, you can use dice or get them to jump from one step to another on one leg to work on the gross motor skills.
- Finger exercises. Put on your favourite piece of music and roll some dough between your palms, pinch the dough, using your thumb and each finger in turn, stretch the dough and repeat until the song has finished.

Weekly Phonics Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)

- Make a transport museum. Collect different types of transport. Write the initial sound for each vehicle, put the sound and vehicle into different containers and set them up as a display.
- Write the digraphs, sh, ch, th, ng, ai, ee, igh, oa, oo, ar, ur, ou/ow, on a piece of card. Place them around the garden. Fill up some water balloons and using a felt tip write on the same digraphs. If your child can read the digraph they can take the balloon and fire it at the matching card!
 EXT: Ask your child to think of a word which contains the digraph.
 Perhaps they could write the word.

 Click on sets 6, 7, 8 and 9
 - Make a set of words which contain the digraphs above. E.g. rain, chips, sheep,Begin by asking your child to find and bring back to you a word with the ai digraph, ch etc. Turn it into a game and see who wins.

Weekly Writing Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)

- Make a model and write a sentence about it, explaining what it does. Remember to write each sound that you hear in each word. If you don't remember how to write the sound, ask for help. REMEMBER those finger spaces between words!
- Look at the attached sheet- ROCKET. Each day write a sentence to match each picture. Talk about what is happening in the picture before you choose what to write. This is instruction writing. Remember to be 'BOSSY' and use bossy verbs. Use 'time connectives' such as 'First', 'Then', 'Next'...'Finally'.
 - 1. First get the things you need to make a rocket. 2. Then cut out triangles.
 - 3. Next.....

PLEASE REMEMBER TO MAKE THE ROCKET AND PLAY WITH IT!

Write the sounds you hear and ask for help if you can't remember how to write the sound.

 Adult, write 2 words that your child knows and 2 new words. Write each word on a separate piece of paper. Ask your child to cut each word into 6 pieces. Say the word and challenge your child to put it back together correctly.

Learning Project - to be done throughout the week

• Up, up in the air

Take pictures, explain what you noticed and ask an adult to write down your observations.

- Make a set of paper planes using different types of paper or card. Fly them. Which travels the furthest? I wonder why? Can you measure how far it has travelled? Perhaps you could use footsteps to measure.
- Ask an adult to blow up a balloon, let it go! What happens? Does it always go in the same direction? Remember to be careful with balloons!
- Can you make your balloon travel in a straight line? Watch out for the video link on your Purple Mash emails later in the week!
- Make a parachute using some paper. Throw it in the air and watch how it travels to the ground.
 What would happen if you scrunch up the paper? Try it and see.

- Use the museum you made, (see phonics activity) and put each container in order from oldest to newest.
- Make signs to show if the museum is open or closed and perhaps you could charge people to enter. Decide how many pennies it costs and then make a sign to tell visitors. EXT: You might decide to add opening and closing times!
- o Make sandwiches to sell in the café. Decide how much they will cost.

- Look at an atlas. Find the places you have visited. What did you see when you were there?
 Can you find photos to remind you?
- Where would you like to go? Do you want to see penguins? Perhaps you could visit Boulder Beach in South Africa. Can you find it? How would you get there?
- O What would you pack in your suitcase? WHY?
- Find a bag and pack the thing you would need for an overnight visit. Take a photograph of the items and explain your choices.
