**Purple Mash**

Even if you are focusing your learning by using this grid as opposed to the activities on Purple Mash, please ensure that you check your Purple Mash regularly for any emails or resources. Please note that the red notification symbol on the purple 'Alerts' bell is no longer active – you will need to click on the bell ('Alerts') for any notifications including comments from your teacher. You can also click '2Dos' for any new set. If you click on 'Work', then use the arrow drop-downs to select your class, then you can find your own folder where you can save things, your completed 2Dos, and a weekly folder where extra resources can be saved (for example maths activity sheets which used to be found on White Rose). Please see the below images to help you.

If you search for the app '2Email' you will be able to access your child's emails. Please make sure you check these for any key updates or information from your teacher.

Create a story map of the seed's journey.</li> <li>• Write a sentence to go with each part of the story.</li> <li>• Sequence the pictures below. Add a sentence to each picture.</li> <li>• Remember to write the sounds you hear! Each day write 'Tricky words': the, they, she, he, me, my, said, no, go, come. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Write them in crayon, in salt, paint, felt tip.</li> <li>○ Use plastic letters to make the words.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Handwriting skills and activities. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Thread pasta onto string.</li> <li>○ Use tweezers to pick up raisins.</li> <li>○ Pass marbles from one hand to the other.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

Learning Project - to be done throughout the week	

- **Let's get Creative**

- Cut out and paste together the different parts of a flower (see below). Can you name the different sections?
- Can you paint some of the flowers and trees you can see outside? Can you name the flowers?
- Make a beautiful bird's nest from wool/ yarn and glue!
- Make some **Spring** murals on the windows using simple foam sheets and water!
- Use broccoli to print blossom trees!

- **Gardening Time**

- Sprinkle cress seeds onto various materials. Can you grow it on damp cotton wool, foil, grease proof paper?
- Observe and record your findings.
- What do plants need to grow?
- Which plants come from bulbs and which plants come from seeds? Research in books or on the internet.

- **Whether the weather be hot.....**

- Make your own anemometer and measure the wind speed.



You will need 4 paper cups, straws or sticks, tape, a pencil and a nail to push through the cross section of the straws and into the pencil.

- Keep a daily record of how many times it spins in one minute. Will you measure this at the same time each day? Which was the windiest day? How do you know?
- Create a superhero. Add a long cape. Attach your superhero to a stick. Which direction is the wind blowing?
