Even if you are focusing your learning by using this grid as opposed to the activities on Purple Mash, please ensure that you check your Purple Mash regularly for any emails or resources. Please note that the red notification symbol on the purple 'Alerts' bell is no longer active – you will need to click on the bell ('Alerts') for any notifications including comments from your teacher. You can also click '2Dos' for any new set. If you click on 'Work', then use the arrow drop-downs to select your class, then you can find your own folder where you can save things, your completed 2Dos, and a weekly folder where extra resources can be saved (for example maths activity sheets which used to be found on White Rose). If you search for the app '2Email' you will be able to access your child's emails. Please make sure you check these for any key updates or information from your teacher.

This week, we thought it would be fun to celebrate World Book Day all week and enjoy some of our favourite stories.

- Oi frog is a rhyming book. Do you know any other rhyming stories? Can you think of any words that rhyme with bed, pen, chair, car, book? Write your words.
- In the story, frogs sit on logs but what lives underneath logs? Go on a mini beast hunt. Carefully roll the log away. What insects can you see in the habitat? Be sure to gently replace the log to where you found it. When you get home have a go at drawing what you saw. Could you label your picture?
- Sing the song 5 Little Speckled Frogs <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=WSC-gHBU_d0</u> Look at the number sentences can you work out the answers? Use your fingers to help you.
- Play musical logs. Create some log shapes on the floor using paper, cushions, or blankets. Jump and move like a frog in time to the music. When the music stops, you must sit on a log!

- Listen to the story which bits did you enjoy? Why? What did Mrs Large want and why?
- Could you make an elephant mask (see ideas below)? What paint colours would you mix to make grey? Could you do some colour mixing to explore?
- Do you have any grey clothes? Could you dress up as one of the characters from the story?

• Do you like this story? Can you explain your opinion using the sentence 'I liked/didn't like the story

because...'. Try and write your sentence with a grownup.

- Could you draw your own family, like stick man and his family? Think about the size of each family member. Who is the tallest? Who is the shortest? How else can you tell who is who?
- When you are outside on a walk, look at the sticks can you find one that looks like Stickman?
- If you find a selection of sticks, could you compare them using mathematical language like small, medium, large, long/longer/longest, short/shorter/shortest?

- This story is about a family of owls. What were the 3 owlets called? Who was your favourite character in the story? Why did you choose them?
- Owls are nocturnal. What does this mean? Can you name 5 more nocturnal animals? Could you use the internet to help you research?
- Could you create a fact sheet or mini non-fiction book about owls and nocturnal animals? You could use the mini book template below.
- Could you make a healthy owl themed snack (see pictures below)?
- Maybe you could tear pieces of paper to create an owl collage (see pictures below).

- Could you make a video about why it is your favourite book? Maybe you could send it to a family member or friend? It might encourage them to read it themselves.
- Could you dress up as a character as your favourite book? Send us a picture via Purple Mash we would love to see your costume!






















In 2021 World Book Day, just like everything else, will be different. Here are lots of ideas to have a fun World Book Day in lockdown.
