School is hosting one event after another. It is so good to be able to offer the children exciting opportunities to enrich the curriculum again.

Year 2 learned all about Easter from Rev. Jacky and Margaret Poole when they came into school to tell us the Easter story and show us how the chocolate Easter egg originated from the Easter story. It is always lovely to have Church in to support school (RRS.14Article 14 of the UNCRC says that children and young people are free to be of any or no religion). The children all made an Easter card to share with someone special, it even had a surprise chick inside!

On Monday 21st March, **Year 5** had a great day at Chiltern Open Air Museum to enrich their topic on the Victorians. The children took part in three workshops which involved them making rag rugs, constructing bricks and experiencing playing with the types of toys Victorian children would have enjoyed.

The sun shone all day and it was lovely for the children to eat their lunch on the grass and enjoy walking around the





large museum site. It was a lot of fun and the workshops added a huge amount to the children's understanding of what life was like growing up in Victorian times.



Year 2 have been studying the Great Fire of London. It was great to have firefighters from Thame Fire Station in to talk to us all about the fire engine and fire safety. We learnt about what to do if we are in an emergency and learnt memorable phrases such as stop, drop and roll and stay low, then go, go, go! It was lovely to have the firefighters show us all how the fire engine works and every child got to have a go with the hose!







The whole school took part in Fairtrade fortnight.

In school, we learn a lot about children's rights and the Sustainable Development Goals and our aim this year is to bring them all together to highlight how important Fairtrade is to ensure a fairer world for farmers, producers, their families and communities. In class, we will look at how farmers lives are affected by climate change and how Fairtrade helps to support them. The Year 5 MAD (Make a Difference) club have organised a number of activities and events for the children. These include:
