Curriculum



Year 5 have been learning all about Ancient Greece in their history and geography lessons this term. The children had the opportunity to use the VR headsets to explore the geography of Mount Olympus and the Acropolis of Athens.

In Year 1 we have been learning how to write instructions about how to plant a seed in order for it to grow. The children liked learning about imperative verbs (bossy verbs) and how to use these when writing instructions. Once their instructions were written, the children followed them and planted their own sunflower seeds. We are excited to see how tall our sunflowers grow over the next few weeks!
