To introduce their new topic of **Judaism**, Year 4 had a visit from Rabbi Zvi Solomons. Throughout the morning, the children listened to Hebrew prayers, discussed the origins of Judaism and viewed the Torah scroll. As per Jewish traditions, **the boys wore Kippah's** (skull caps) when listening to the Rabbi. The children then split into classes and were



invited to Zvi's "dining room table" to discuss the significance and importance of family time on the Shabbat, or Sabbath day. At the end of the session, the children were able to try some Matzo and Challah bread.

The Year 3 and 4 girls football team attended a competition representing St Andrew's. The girls were quick to gel together, creating a fantastic team. They played courageously and gave all they had out on the pitch, winning one game and losing two. Unfortunately, the girls did not make it through the group stage but they did make their school very proud.

The **Year 3** children went back in time and pretended to be evacuees on their trip to Lincolnsfield. They learnt all about the strictness of a 1940's teacher and discovered what it would be like to be in their classroom. An **incendiary bomb landed on the roof of a building** and the children had to work together quickly by using a stirrup pump to put it out. They learnt what living in the 1940's was like and experienced a simulation of the Blitz.







The Year 1 children have enjoyed learning all about plants and how to grow their own sunflowers. They have planted their own seed, and the children have been visiting them daily to check they have all they need. "They need sunlight, air and water to survive" said one child.





The weather was damp but spirits were high as the **EYFS children ventured through Wendover Woods**. They supported and encouraged each other, faced physical and mental challenges and worked together, creating a great day out! Thank you children and parents.

In Year 3, the children practised their coding skills using the school robots. They used two different programs and had fun getting the robots to move around the classrooms and make noises. On the same afternoon, the children practised using the special Lego kits, which are linked to a bluetooth device. The children made models of a bumble bee visiting a flower, that moved. The children enjoyed using the equipment, which helped to reinforce some key ideas from our science curriculum.
