The EYFS children have been taking great care of the beans they planted, learning about all the things the plants will need to help them grow. We have watched intently as they have grown over the past few weeks and with a bit of patience...they are now sizeable beanstalks, tall enough to reach the Giant's Castle!



At the beginning of this term, **Year 4 visited a local farm** to consolidate their learning in the science topic 'Living

things and their habitats'. The children learned more about classification, invertebrates and even investigated which animal dropping belonged to which animal! Later that day, as part of their topic 'Improving our local area', the children ventured out again to conduct a litter picking walk around Chinnor. It was a very active and fun day!





On the 6th June, 25 children represented St. Andrew's at the **Thame Partnership Cross Country event.** The event had four races, which were mixed year groups. They raced against five other schools, with at least 35 children in each race. They made the school very proud, each child put in a tremendous amount of effort and ran their socks off. Some children even won their respective races, **Sophia and Isaac came first by a country mile!** I would like to thank all the children who took part for being such a positive example for the school.

This week Year 6 visited Wycombe Mosque and had a fantastic time deepening our learning and knowledge of the Islamic faith. We were shown around the mosque by Iman Tanveer who explained the teachings of Islam and the Quran in a fun and relatable way linking things to our everyday lives as well as telling us about his life. It was a really interesting day learning about the culture and religion directly from

someone of the faith.





This past week has been filled with adventure for the children in Year 3. We have exercised our legs as well as our minds. The first walk that we completed was to Aston Rowant, where we made observations about how many different plants and trees we could find along the way. The children walked to the local windmill and were taught how it functions and told many interesting facts. The final walk involved the children walking up Chinnor hill, the children thought the view was incredible.



The children in Year 5 have been delving into the world of Ancient Greece through a range of mediums. In their Art lessons, the children imaginatively crafted pinch pots inspired by the



moulding clay. They focused on using a range of moving images and a traditional key pattern from that period. The children examined the differences between modern day pottery and that of the **Ancient Greeks.**



Year 1 paid their first visit to the re-opened library, and absolutely loved it! They were desperate to sit in the reading nooks, and shared lots of different stories with each other. They all chose to keep reading their library books when they got back to class, and some even read them during playtime. We can't wait to go back.



The first was on their 1:1 devices, using Epic (a reading app) to learn all about coding and then to answer comprehension questions. The second task was utilising their **coding skills to programme lights and movements on robots. Children were able to demonstrate some very impressive skills and they can't wait to use the robots again!**
