### **Polite Reminder - Uniform**

We introduced children coming to school in their PE kit on PE days and asked for parents to ensure children wore the correct uniform. Parents and children appear to find this helpful but some children are arriving with different colours and styles to the school uniform which is on our school website. Please note this does not include cycle shorts, named sportswear or sportswear hoodies on non-PE days. If some children wear different uniform it is not fair on the children or parents who comply and the staff who need to follow it up. Please discuss this with your child and if there is any clarification required we are more than happy to help.



## Curriculum outdoors

### In previous newsletters I shared the plan to have Term 6 with a focus on outdoor learning. Mrs Thompson our outdoor leader has put together a plan for the whole school. We do have plans to introduce a small outdoor play stage for the children to perform on at playtimes: one for EYFS and one for Key stage 1 playground. Mr Craig and Mr Castle are supporting this. We will purchase tents for story-telling and an outdoor practical workshop.
