The children have hit the ground running in Year 6. They have already produced amazing amounts of work. We have been tasked with creating a display for the church. The children have also completed multiple lessons on the importance of internet safety.



Year 5 have certainly made us proud with how they have started the year! This week, we have been exploring different forces in their science lessons. The children have learnt about how some forces work in opposition to each other and identified different forces in action.



The children in Year 1 have been using the classroom equipment during a practical maths lesson about sorting objects. They have been exploring how to group objects using counters, cubes and Numicon, then recording their findings. They have been sorting by size, colour and shape!
