Year 5 enjoyed their residential trip to Youlbury this term. The children had a go at activities such as the 3G swing, Jacob's ladder, nature art and crate stacking. Everyone demonstrated great skills of resilience, creativity, teamwork and courage! We were really proud of them all.





Year 6 were fortunate enough to have the ambulance service come in and talk to us about CPR and 'Start a Heart'. We learned lots about how the heart works and



how it affects the rest of our organs in our body. We had the chance to practice our CPR skills on dummies, which was fun and exciting whilst also giving us skills for life. Thank you to Mrs Mantle and Joe for coming in and teaching us this valuable lesson!

In EYFS, we have been exploring countries all Around the World. From food markets in Africa, to exploring the Amazon Rainforest in South America. The children listened closely to the sounds of the rainforest and used their crafted rainsticks to re-enact what they heard.

Our Year 3 children have been painting vibrant, floral landscapes, inspired by the decorative style of Gustav Klimt. Gustav Klimt was an Austrian symbolic painter from the 19th century. The children have been using bold coloured animals and floral patterns to bring their nature inspired scenes to life.





It has been a 'Noisy' start in science this term as

Year 4 children have been studying sound. They have considered how sounds are created and travel. Investigations included finding out

which materials are best for soundproofing and understanding how sound can travel quicker through a solid than air, by talking through string telephones. The children also had the opportunity to design their own musical instruments and some children have made an instrument at home. They had to consider how to change both the pitch and amplitude of the sounds produced.





The children in Year 2 have been working very hard this term - in literacy we have been thinking about our spelling and handwriting, the classes enjoyed a game of 'heads-up' to practise both skills. We have also enjoyed a session with the boom-whackers as a reward for all their hard work!



The Year 1 children were lucky enough to watch a puppet play about The Lost Sheep and then shared their thoughts on how to be a good shepherd and how they would feel if they lost something. The RE Inspired team then talked to the children about how this story links to God and his followers. The children made their own sheep which they thoroughly enjoyed.

Good luck to our Y6 children on their residential trip. Have a great time.
