


As a writer-in-schools, I am fortunate enough to visit a great many excellent schools, but rarely of the calibre of St Andrew's.

What made my visit on Wednesday 4th November so very special was the school's commitment to the day and the experience as a whole. The children were highly keen, creative and responsive throughout, in both the assembly and the workshops. The children here are clearly passionate readers as they are great listeners, articulate speakers, and have wide vocabularies. Moreover, their ideas and offerings in the workshops were exceptional, and their resulting poems were testament to this. But what makes a day like this is not the children - they always rise to the occasion, given the opportunity, - it's the teachers. ALL of the teachers present were 110% committed (no marking at the side like I often see/or chatting during an assembly...) – modelling how to respond to a visitor. The staff were actively participating in everything, and even joining in with the space assembly and the workshops. This exceptional level of commitment from teachers, TAs and indeed trainee teachers is rare. Often, I visit a class to do a workshop to discover that the teacher has taken it as PPA time out, as clearly, they don't feel it's a valuable experience to work/write alongside with a children's writer. The very opposite was true of St Andrew's. The dedication from the staff and the resulting atmosphere in the workshops - as one teacher rightly commented - was nearly spiritual - empowering children to take risks with their creativities and their ideas. I am due to return to this outstanding school in January, which I am very much looking forward to already.

Well done to everyone for making our visitor feel welcome. As I sign off this newsletter I think back to our vision at the start. We really do live the vision '*Protect, Trust, Hope and Persevere*' at St Andrew's. Thank you to all our stakeholders for making it possible.
