

Here is a list of reading resources you may wish to explore.

- Oxford Owl You will find a range of free e-books and resources, including spellings, phonics and maths for ages 3 11. <u>https://www.oxfordowl.co.uk/for-home/</u>
- Storyline Online Free videos of stories being read are available. Select YouTube (or an alternative provider you prefer to watch on). You can then click on 'Teacher Guide' to access synopsis, theme, cross curricular activities and questions about the text. https://www.storylineonline.net
- Book Trust A super resource, particularly for younger readers. There are read along options and lots of games related to the stories. Key recommended texts for EYFS and KS1. <u>https://www.booktrust.org.uk/books-and-reading/have-some-fun/storybooksand-games/</u>
- Amazon Try searching 'Children's eBooks' then select 'free'. They are available to download onto kindles / devices. Some are only available for a limited time. They are particularly suitable for KS2. Of course, you may wish to purchase some eBooks for your child.
- Vooks You can sign up for a one-month free trial. They are currently offering (after free sign-up) 2 free weekly 'lesson plans' to support reading at home with your child, however these are more suitable for KS2. The eBooks are in a video format however you can simply pause / mute the sound so that your child can read along. https://www.vooks.com/parent-resources
