Can you complete our pirate puzzle?






















This term <u>Year 3</u> have been having great fun learning how to country dance. The children have also been making soup out of healthy vegetables. The class enjoyed chopping up the vegetables and frying them, before adding stock. Most of the class loved trying the soup, which was lovely and warming. In science, we put tablets in film canisters and added water. Some of them exploded and flew into the air. It was very exciting.



The children are getting ready for the art show, too. Here they are turning unwanted plastics into fabulous fish, and scrap fabrics into a large and a lovely wall hanging.



Year 6 took part in an RE inspired session discussing personal responses to death and the process of grief. They considered the Christian perspective on life and death and thought about how life on earth can be seen as only part of a journey.





In science the children have been studying evolution and inheritance. They researched Charles Darwin and looked at characteristics they have inherited from their family members.

They have also designed and made their own delicious quiches to take home for their families to devour and evaluate!











In <u>Year 4</u>, the children have been learning about animals (including Humans) in Science. They have been studying the digestive systems and diets of different groups of animals and conducted a scientific investigation with eggs - on how different drinks effect our teeth.
