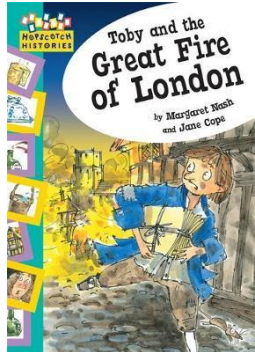


Literacy

Topic
