Growing and changing - describe 'good' and 'not so good' feelings and how feelings can affect our physical state.

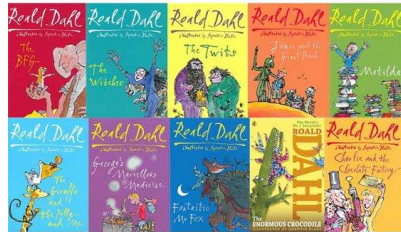
Music
