Do we eat the same foods? What is the weather like? Draw pictures or make a fact file.	Go on a sensory walk. What can you see, hear, smell, touch, or taste? Write a list or draw pictures.	Create a map of Peru or South America using any materials you would like - paint, crayon, collage, nature, or even a mix of them all. Remember your phonics sounds to help you!	With an adult create a snakes and ladders game up to 20 and have a go at playing it.	List the 7 continents in order from biggest to smallest. Can you find them on a map? Can you find a fact about each one, for example which has the most animals, or which is the hottest?	Make a model of a body out of clay or playdough. Can you name any internal body parts? What do they do? If you're not sure, can you find out?	Can you help to cook a traditional Peruvian meal or dish? Or can you find some food from Peru and make it into something? We would love to see photos.	Can you draw and label a picture to show what a Christian believes about God.
