Mild 	Find a book, article or website (with help from a grown up) you like about castles or knights, and draw a picture to tell us more. Can you label it? When was it built? Write a sentence to tell us about it.	What materials were used to build castles? Why were these materials used?	Draw a picture of a knight; remembering to include the protective armour he wore, and perhaps a horse and dragon too!
Hot 	Write your own sequel to 'Zog and the Flying Doctors', one of our literacy books this term. What would Princess Pearl, Sir Gadabout and Zog get up to? Who would they help?	There are 60 children in year 1. If oranges are sold in bags of 10, how many bags would you need so everyone has one? Write a number sentence to tell me more or draw a picture.	Can you list 5 kings or queens that have ruled England over the years? Can you find a picture of one?	Have a look at the items that you can recycle in your home. Sort items into recyclable and non-recyclable. Make a poster to promote recycling. Why is it so good for our planet?	Can you make a knight's shield? Use any materials that you like but try to think about why you are using those materials.
Spicy 	Write a diary entry imagining you are a knight in a Medieval Castle - what sort of things would you do? Try to use the days of the week to practice your spellings.	If I cut a melon into 4 equal pieces, what would the fraction be for one piece? What about 3 pieces? Can you write some fraction questions of your own? Draw a picture.	Can you find and name the 4 countries and capital cities in the UK? Do any of them have castles? Maybe you could make a leaflet to encourage people to visit a castle.	Research which materials are waterproof. You could try testing foil, paper and clingfilm and see if water will drip through them. Could these materials be used in your model of a castle?	Can you design a model of a castle? What features would it have? How would you join it together? What materials would you use and why?
