| Mild<br>    | Write instructions on how to have a perfect Sunday morning. You could choose places with different temperatures or places with different amounts of sunlight. | Find a plant and make an observational drawing. | Hot<br>    | Write instructions on how to tame a fictional animal such as a unicorn or troll. Try and work out the cost of one family meal.<br><a href="#">Global Goal 4</a> | With your parent's help and permission, see if you can find an elderly person who has known Chinnor all their lives and interview them. What changes have happened in the village? Why have these changes occurred? How was life in Chinnor different when they were a child? What was their school like? | Create an experiment where you plant radishes and test the effects of different fertilizers on growth.   | Make a print of a flower using string and cardboard. | Spicy<br> | Write instructions for a revolting recipe, remember to include subtitles, such as ingredients, method and a warning! Include pictures of each step and numbered list of what to do. Try to include a range of conjunctions. | Plan a holiday for your family. Include the cost of accommodation, travel, food, entertainment, and insurance. How much would it cost?   | Make a map of central Chinnor, with a key, compass and symbols to show different features.  | Design and make a seed from a newly discovered plant using junk materials.   | Make a 3d, free-standing model of a plant out of objects that you have at home.   |
