Fractions

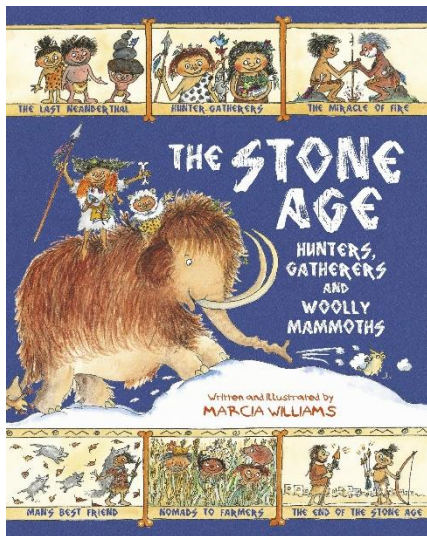
- Use common factors to simplify fractions; use common multiples to express fractions in the same denomination.

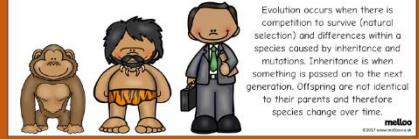
