Non-fiction: Labels and captions: Label and caption photographs of ourselves. Describe and compare pictures of Peru, animals, Chinnor and fruit with labels and captions. Non-Fiction: Lists: What would Paddington pack in his suitcase?

Maths

Addition and subtraction within 10:

Add using part-whole models; adding together and adding more. Understand fact families (2+3=5; 3+2=5; 5-2=3; 5-3=2). Embed number bonds to 10. Subtraction by crossing out, counting back, and finding the difference.
