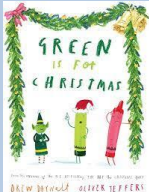
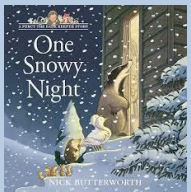


Literacy Articles 28 & 29

Poetry: Write a poem about fireworks and Bonfire Night. Investigate rhyming words.
Story-telling: Descriptive recounts. Use adjectives to describe and adapt a story.
Letters: Write a letter to Santa or your family.
Poetry: Write poetry all about the colours of Christmas.

Phonics: We spend 30 minutes on our phonics daily. We learn to recall the sounds that letters and groups of letters make within words, and blend them together.

What are our similarities and differences? Can you think of any differences in personality as well as appearances?

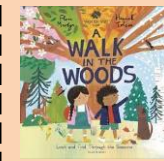

Add using part-whole models; adding together and adding more. Understand fact families (2+3=5; 3+2=5; 5-2=3; 5-3=2). Embed number bonds to 10. Subtraction by crossing out, counting back, and finding the difference.

Geometry – shape:

Identifying, sorting and exploring the properties of 2D and 3D shapes.
