

Literacy

Narrative: Stories about fantasy worlds – creating characters and settings. Write an adventure story in a fantasy setting.

Story book: Where The Wild Things Are

Poetry: Rhyme and pattern. Write a dinosaur poem.

Story book: The Dinosaur Who Lost His Roar

Phonics: Each day we spend 20 minutes on our phonics. We learn to recognise the sounds letters and groups of letters make within words.

Music

Charanga – Dinosaurs songs. Listen to and appraise songs. Identify and keep a beat. KS1 singing practise on Tuesdays.

Art

Sculpture. Make dinosaur models and fossils using clay and playdough.

PSHCE

Being My Best. Keeping our bodies and minds healthy through food and exercise. Growth mindset – how can we help ourselves when things are difficult?

PE – Medium Sized Ball Skills

Rolling, catching and throwing with accuracy. Learn the importance of physical exercise and the effect on our bodies. Team games.

Maths

Measurement: Compare lengths and heights. Measure lengths of objects.

Number: Place Value within 50: Recognising and ordering numbers within 50; tens and ones; comparing objects and numbers within 50; count in 2's, 5's and 10's.

Number: Addition and Subtraction: using related facts in number sentences to solve problems.

History – Events beyond living memory and famous people

Dinosaurs

Understand what fossils are and how they are formed. Learn when in history dinosaurs lived. Learn about Mary Anning and her work.



Collective Worship

Whole school Collective Worship will be on Monday and Friday, and KS1 Collective Worship on Thursday, focussing on our value.

RE – Christianity – Easter

Learn about the Easter story and the importance of Palm Sunday. Big question: Why was Jesus welcomed like a King on Palm Sunday?

Christian Value Forgiveness

Computing – 2 Create a story

Using Purple Mash, create an animated story book (e-book), with different backgrounds and sounds.

Science – Pupil Led Investigations

Following a visit from Professor Bubbleworks, children will come up with their own ideas for investigations and experiments.

They will begin to make predictions, observe and collect data, record their findings and write evaluations. Children will create a poster for an experiment and enter the Big Science Event competition for British Science Week.
