<ul> <li>Watch a video lesson on the White Rose Website: <u>White Rose maths</u> <u>lessons</u></li> <li>Work on <u>Times Table Rockstars</u> - your child will have an individual login to access this.</li> <li>Play on <u>Hit the Button</u> - focus on number bonds, halves, doubles and times tables.</li> <li>Practise multiplication and division facts. Make some cards to practise this.</li> <li>How many different ways can you show this addition: 145 plus 136? You could show it using dienes, place value counters, on an abacus, with place value cards. What other questions can you make using this one fact and those numbers?</li> <li>Write down everything you know about addition and subtraction. Create a poster using this information.</li> <li>Play some of the addition and subtraction games online here: <u>Addition</u> and subtraction games</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Listen to an audio book on audible here: <u>Audible</u> You will need to start a 30 day free trial.</li> <li>Encourage your child to find an advert in a magazine/newspaper and find the meaning of any new vocabulary, especially technical words.</li> <li>Visit <u>Storynory</u> and let your child choose a story to listen to. Can they summarise the main events? Ask them to write down any words they are unsure of, and ask them to try and retell the story that they have heard to an adult.</li> <li>Explore new vocabulary you find when reading. What are the origins of this word? Can it be modified? Can you find any synonyms or antonyms for your new word?</li> <li>With your child, look in magazines, newspapers and books for new vocabulary they are unfamiliar with. They could use a highlighter to highlight in magazines and newspapers.</li> <li>Read The BFG, by Roald Dahl. Complete these activities: <u>The BFG</u></li> <li>Watch Newsround and discuss what is happening in the wider world.</li> </ul>

<ul> <li>Practise the Year 3/4 for Common Exception words.</li> <li>Choose 5 Common Exception words. Write a synonym, antonyms, the meaning and an example of how to use the word in a sentence. Can the word be modified?</li> <li>Look at the spellings on Purple Mash</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Read Fantastic Mr Fox. A pdf is available here: <u>Fantastic Mr Fox</u></li> <li>Draw a map to show the land that Mr Fox lives on. You can create details and use the countryside around Chinnor as an inspiration.
