


Home Learning Grid for those who are isolating.

Weekly Maths Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)	Weekly Reading Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)
<ul> <li>Watch a video lesson on the White Rose Website: <u>White Rose</u></li> <li>Work on <u>Times Table Rockstars</u> - your child will have an individual login to access this.</li> <li>Play on <u>Hit the Button</u> - focus on number bonds, halves, doubles and times tables.</li> <li>Practise multiplication and division facts. Make some cards to practise this.</li> <li>Watch this video about arrays: <u>What is an array?</u> Create a poster showing different arrays for 12.</li> <li>Write down everything you know about multiplication and division. Create a poster using this information.</li> <li>Play some of the multiplication and division games online here: <u>Multiplication and division games</u></li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Listen to an audio book on audible here: <u>Audible</u> You will need to start a 30 day free trial.</li> <li>Encourage your child to find an advert in a magazine/newspaper and find the meaning of any new vocabulary, especially technical words.</li> <li>Visit <u>Storynory</u> and let your child choose a story to listen to. Can they summarise the main events? Ask them to write down any words they are unsure of, and ask them to try and retell the story that they have heard to an adult.</li> <li>Explore new vocabulary you find when reading. What are the origins of this word? Can it be modified? Can you find any synonyms or antonyms for your new word?</li> <li>With your child, look in magazines, newspapers and books for new vocabulary they are unfamiliar with. They could use a highlighter to highlight in magazines and newspapers.</li> <li>Complete these activities: Into The <u>Forest</u></li> <li>Watch Newsround and discuss what is happening in the wider world.</li> </ul>

<ul> <li>Practise the Year 3/4 for Common Exception words.</li> <li>Choose 5 Common Exception words. Write a synonym, antonyms, the meaning and an example of how to use the word in a sentence. Can the word be modified?</li> <li>Look at the spellings on Purple Mash</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Read chapter 1 of Ottoline and the Yellow Cat here: <u>Ottoline and the Yellow</u> <u>Cat Chapter 1</u></li> <li>Write five facts and opinions about Ottoline and Mr Munroe.</li> <li>Write down five questions you would like to ask about the characters.</li> </ul>



## <u>Science</u>

This term we are learning about humans and other animals. Find out about different food groups here: <u>What is a balanced diet?</u> Draw a plate, showing the four main food groups, label each section and draw examples of food groups in that section. Can you find out what happens if you don't eat a balanced diet? How might it affect someone's health?

### <u>RE:</u>

This term we are thinking about the miracles that Jesus performed. Try to re-enact one of the miracles that Jesus performed using puppets that you create. You could choose <u>Jesus</u> <u>Feeds the 5000</u> Whilst you watch the film, think about what a miracle is.

#### Reflect:

Our value this term is trust. Discuss with your parents who you know that is trustworthy. Read about Phillipe Quint's lost violin here: Lost violin story How do you think Phillipe felt when he realised he had lost his violin? Think about how you have helped other people in your life, and why the taxi driver returned the violin.
