| <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Working on Times Table Rockstars - your child will have an individual login to access this.• Play on Hit the Button - focus on number bonds, halves, doubles and times tables.• Practise addition and subtraction facts for all numbers to 20, e.g. $9 + 8$, $17 - 9$. Make some cards to practice this.• Make a game of pelmanism using sums and differences of multiples of 10, e.g. $50 + 80$, $120 - 90$• Create a quiz about pairs of two-digit numbers with a total of 100, e.g. $32 + 68$, or $32 + \square = 100$, that you could ask some friends. | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Listen to an audio book on audible here: Audible• Encourage your child to find an advert in a magazine/newspaper and find the meaning of any new vocabulary, especially technical words.• Visit StoryNory.com and let your child choose a story from around the world to listen to. Can they summarise the main events by drawing a comic strip?• Explore new vocabulary you find when reading. What are the origins of this word? Can it be modified? Can you find any synonyms or antonyms for your new word?• With your child, look in magazines, newspapers and books for new vocabulary they are unfamiliar with. They could use a highlighter to highlight in magazines and newspapers.• Read the story on The Oak Academy. Your child could read it to you if they are confident or you could read it to them.
