<b>Weekly Maths Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)</b>	<b>Weekly Reading Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)</b>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Working on <a href="#">Times Table Rockstars</a> - your child will have an individual login to access this.</li><li>• Play on <a href="#">Hit the Button</a> - focus on number bonds, halves, doubles and times tables.</li><li>• Practise multiplication and division facts. Make some cards to practise this.</li><li>• Try telling the time to the nearest 5 minutes. How many different ways can you write the same amount of time? Roman numerals? 24 hour time?</li><li>• Create a quiz about pairs of two-digit numbers with a total of 100, e.g. 32 + 68, or <math>32 + \square = 100</math>, that you could ask some friends.</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Listen to an audio book on audible here: <a href="#">Audible</a></li><li>• Encourage your child to find an advert in a magazine/newspaper and find the meaning of any new vocabulary, especially technical words.</li><li>• Visit StoryNory.com and let your child choose a story from around the world to listen to. Can they summarise the main events by drawing a comic strip?</li><li>• Explore new vocabulary you find when reading. What are the origins of this word? Can it be modified? Can you find any synonyms or antonyms for your new word?</li><li>• With your child, look in magazines, newspapers and books for new vocabulary they are unfamiliar with. They could use a highlighter to highlight in magazines and newspapers.</li><li>• Complete this reading for pleasure activity online <a href="https://classroom.thenational.academy/lessons/to-develop-reading-for-pleasure-cgukgt">https://classroom.thenational.academy/lessons/to-develop-reading-for-pleasure-cgukgt</a></li><li>• Watch Newsround and discuss what is happening in the wider world.</li></ul>
