Purple Mash

Please ensure that you check your Purple Mash regularly for any emails or resources. Please note that the red notification symbol on the purple 'Alerts' bell is no longer active – you will need to click on the bell ('Alerts') for any notifications including comments from your teacher on submitted work. You can click '2Dos' to find any new work set. If you click on 'Work', then use the arrow drop-downs to select your class, then you can find your own folder where you can save things.

Weekly Maths Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)

- Complete daily maths lessons on White Rose Maths home learning. We are learning about multiplication and division.

- We will upload the accompanying White Rose worksheets to Purple Mash, these can be found under weekly folders in your class folder. We will also email these to you on Purple Mash.
- Get your child to play on [Times Table Rockstars](#).
- Allow your child to play on [Hit the Button](#) - focus on times tables, division facts and squared numbers.
- Daily [arithmetic](#) for different areas of maths. Ask your child to work on '7-11 years' activities and try to focus on multiplication and division.
- Maths tasks are also being set on [Purple Mash](#) (Worksheets may also be available).

Weekly Reading Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)

- Read chapter 1 of Beowulf. It tells how Grendel warred with the Danes

- Ask your child to read a chapter from their home reading book or a book that they have borrowed from the library.
- Following this, ask your child to summarise the events from the chapter. They could bullet point what happened, create a comic strip or present the information in their own creative way.
- Direct your child to [Love Reading](#). Ask them to explore the Book of the Month and previous books of the month. How many have they read?
- Read and complete book chapters and quizzes set on [Purple Mash](#).

Weekly Spellings Tasks (Aim to do 10 per week)

- **Spellings:** Purple Mash Spring 1 Week 1. The list for the week is in your class Purple Mash folder, along with a 2Do activity. On Friday, test yourself on the 'Test' 2Do. Note: This will not be available until Friday.

An Anglo-Saxon 2do will be set on Purple Mash each week. This week, your 2do is 'Who were the Anglo-Saxons?' You will need to research who the Anglo-Saxons were and what their life was like. Use BBC Bitesize to help you.

Draw a full-size helmet like the one found at Sutton Hoo on some unwanted cardboard packaging. Make it big enough to fit your face. Then decorate it and colour or paint it. Have a photo taken of you wearing your Saxon helmet/mask. You could put the photo in your history project and write a description to go with it if you wish.



Computing:

Spreadsheets. In this unit you will learn how to use spreadsheets using the Purple Mash program 2Calculate. Spreadsheets are used for organising information. We will be setting 2Calculate as a new 2do weekly, however the task you will be asked to complete using this program will differ from week to week.

This week, you will use 2Calculate to learn how to enter information and do some simple calculations on a spreadsheet. When you launch the 2Calculate 2do select the 'Sheet' tab then select an 'Empty Sheet'. Explore the empty spreadsheet. The word 'cells' is used to describe each box in a spreadsheet. Can you work out how to write your name in a cell? Can you change the colour of the cells? See if you can enter a simple calculation into the cells and let 2Calculate work out the answer. First enter a number then go into the next cell to the right and click the '+' sign button on the right-hand side, then move to the next cell and enter another number. Now put the '=' sign in the next cell and see how 2Calculate works out the answer.

Can you enter an image into your spreadsheet? The image toolbox is located above the colours on the right-hand side. Press 'set image' then the 'clipart' button to change the selection of images available. Add a selection of different pictures to the spreadsheet. You may notice that you can't drag the pictures around into different cells. Click on one of the cells with a picture in then click on the control's toolbox (located near the image toolbox). Select the 'move cell' tool represented by a symbol of four arrows in a cross. A little symbol will now appear in the top right-hand corner of the image to show that it is now moveable.

Please demonstrate each of the skills you've practiced in the 2Calculate spreadsheet. Once you've presented an example of each skill you can hand in the 2do for us to mark on Purple Mash.

Science:

LO: Explain who and where Buddhism was founded.
