The questions help you to work on these reading skills (reading VIPERS): Vocabulary (look up/discuss words you are unfamiliar with. Develop dictionary skills) Infer (read between the lines) Predict (discuss what might happen next in the story) Explain (eg. who the story is about, what is happening, when the story takes place, where the story takes place) Retrieve (answer questions you can only answer by reading the text carefully) Summarise (sum up what happened in the book or in a chapter)

Topic Learning Projects – Roald Dahl

<u>History:</u> Your research about Roald Dahl will help you learn about some of the key events of the 20th century. Use your Fact file 2do (three week writing project) to show what you have learnt about the life and times of this famous author. Look at the timeline on the Roald Dahl website. Computing:

Spreadsheets. In this unit you will learn how to use spreadsheets using the Purple Mash program 2Calculate. We will be setting 2Calculate as a new 2do weekly, however the task you will be asked to complete using this program will differ from week to week.

Spreadsheets are used for organising information. For example, if you were planning a birthday party you could input to the spreadsheet all the things you will need to get for the party and who you were going to invite. Can you think of any other things that could be stored in a spreadsheet? Many people make lists on paper but the advantage of using a spreadsheet is that it can also do calculations for you. For example, you could enter the cost of the different things that you will need for your party into the spreadsheet and then easily calculate how much money you will need to buy them all.

This week, you will use 2Calculate to learn how to enter information and do some simple calculations on a spreadsheet. When you launch the 2Calculate 2do select the 'Sheet' tab then select an 'Empty Sheet'. Explore the empty spreadsheet. The word 'cells' is used to describe each box in a spreadsheet. Can you work out how to write your name in a cell? Can you change the colour of the cells? See if you can enter a simple calculation into the cells and let 2Calculate work out the answer. First enter a number then go into the next cell to the right and click the '+' sign button on the right-hand side, then move to the next cell and enter another number. Now put the '=' sign in the next cell and see how 2Calculate works out the answer.

Can you enter an image into your spreadsheet? The image toolbox is located above the colours on the righthand side. Press 'set image' then the 'clipart' button to change the selection of images available. Add a selection of different pictures to the spreadsheet. You may notice that you can't drag the pictures around into different cells. Click on one of the cells with a picture in then click on the control's toolbox (located near the image toolbox). Select the 'move cell' tool represented by a symbol of four arrows in a cross. A little symbol will now appear in the top right-hand corner of the image to show that it is now moveable. When moving the cells around, if you place one cell on top of another it will clear the picture in the cell underneath. To prevent cells being overwritten you can 'lock' them by selecting the padlock symbol in the control's toolbox.

Please demonstrate each of the skills you've practiced in the 2Calculate spreadsheet. Once you've presented an example of each skill you can hand in the 2do for us to mark on Purple Mash.

Art and Design:

Quentin Blake is a cartoonist, illustrator and author who has illustrated all of Roald Dahl's books. Have a go at drawing in the style of Quentin Blake. If you Google 'Quentin Blake draw along' you will find several video clips you can watch, and you can draw as Quentin Blake draws. Pause the video to give yourself time to complete each part of the illustrations. You could take photographs of your sketches and email them to us.

Science:

Our topic for this term is **States of Matter**. In this unit you will learn about the differences between solids, liquids and gases, classifying objects and identifying their properties. You will learn how water changes state, exploring melting, freezing, condensing and evaporation. You will also explore the stages of the water cycle.

To introduce the topic, we would like you to identify and explore the **differences between solids**, **liquids and gases**. We will email all the relevant worksheets and resources to you via Purple Mash. To start with, read through the 'Solid Liquid or Gas' PowerPoint. This will explain the different properties of solids, liquids and gases. Watch this short video to learn about the behaviour of particles in states of matter.

Once you've looked at the PowerPoint, complete the 'Sorting Materials' quiz set as a 2do on Purple Mash. Finally, complete the 'Particles and Properties' activity sheet. This sheet is differentiated into 3 different levels. One star is the slightly easier sheet up to three stars which is the trickiest sheet (the stars are in the top lefthand corner of the sheet). Decide on a sheet which you feel comfortable with but will still challenge you. This is a cutting and sticking activity. If you would like, you can email us a picture of your completed table.

<u>RE:</u>

Christianity – Pentecost and the importance of the church to Christians.

Use the Pentecost 2do on Purple Mash to write up what you find out about this Christian festival. We will email you a PowerPoint via Purple Mash to help you with this.
