#### **Purple Mash**

You can click '2Dos' for any new set. If you click on 'Work', then use the arrow drop-downs to select your class, then you can find your own folder where you can save things.

# Weekly Maths Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)

- Daily White Rose Maths lessons these lessons follow what we will be doing in school. Watch the video and then complete the questions in the video.
- Choose a daily problem-solving activity on NRich
- Complete daily maths lessons on bitesize. <u>BBC</u>
   Bitesize
- Play on Times Table Rock Stars.
- Play <u>Hit the Button</u> focus on times tables, division facts and squared numbers.
- Daily <u>arithmetic</u> for different areas of maths. Work on level 4, 5 and 6 activities and try to focus on fractions.

Twice weekly Maths tasks are also being set on Purple Mash.

# Weekly Reading Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)

- Complete Literacy lessons on bitesize: <u>BBC Bitesize</u>
- Read a chapter a day of Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone
- Summarise the events from the chapter. Bullet point what happened, create a comic strip or present the information in your own creative way.
- Have a look at <u>Love Reading</u>. Explore the Book of the Month and previous books of the month. How many have you read?
- Guided Reading we will send out the Harry Potter questions and chapter for you to read
- Log on to <u>Reading Planet</u> to read the books you have been assigned and complete the guizzes.

You can find books for Year 6 on our <u>class pages</u>. Daily reading comprehension tasks are also being set on <u>Purple Mash</u>.

# Weekly Spellings Tasks (Aim to do 10 per week)

- Practise the Year 5/ 6 Common Exception Words Download at: Oxford Owl
- Choose 5 Common Exception words. Then write a synonym, antonym, the meaning and an example of how to use the word in a sentence.
- Complete daily spelling practise on <u>Purple Mash</u>.



- Create a word bank of feelings that you have felt over the week.
- Complete the weekly <a href="SPAG online">SPAG online</a> activity set.

# Weekly Writing Tasks (Aim to do 1 short task per day)

- The Frost Horse
- World famous, flying horse specialist Pie Corbett is putting together The Ultimate Guide to Unicorns and Flying Horses. Pie is well known as
  - a unicorn whisperer and has researched the unicorns of Asia as well as varieties of frost unicorns living in Iceland and other wintry places. Your job, should you accept this mission, is to provide Pie with another entry for his book by writing about a type of unicorn or flying horse.

# Topic Learning Projects – to be done throughout the week.

### Art/DT:

- You have been hired by the Weasley twins to invent a new edible product which they can see from their store. In order to do this, you need to consider the following:
  - What is the unique selling point of your product?
  - When it is eaten, what will it do to the person who has eaten it?
  - Design and make the packaging for your product. Make it eye-catching so that people will but it.
  - Design a persuasive poster to entice people to buy your product.



# Computing:

Text Adventures: Take a look at the Red Riding Hood 2do on purple mash to get an understanding of what a text adventure is. Once you have played around with all the possibilities, have a go at designing and creating a mind map (another 2Do has been set for this) for your own text adventure that we will be making in the coming weeks.



#### Science:

- Pupil Led investigations: Design and build a boat which will float and hold cargo. How much weight can your boat make and stay afloat? Consider:
- The properties the boat will need to stay afloat.
- What materials you use to ensure it is waterproof.

#### Music

Choose a favourite movie and research the soundtrack to it. Who wrote the score? What instruments can you identify? How does it make you feel? Do the tempo and dynamics change?

Is Christianity still a strong religion 2000 years after Jesus was on Earth? Research Christianity - do you think it is still a strong religion? Which countries are considered Christian? Why do people still follow the Christian faith? Create an information poster to show your research.


