THE GOSPEL IN CHURCH Sunday 27th June 2021



When Jesus had crossed in the boat to the other side of the lake, a large crowd gathered round him and he stayed by the lakeside. A woman, who had suffered from a haemorrhage for twelve years, came up behind Jesus and touched

his cloak. "If I can touch even his clothes," she had told herself, "I shall be well again." And the source of her bleeding dried up instantly and she felt in herself that she was cured. Immediately aware that power had gone out from him, Jesus turned round and said, "Who touched me?" Then the woman came forward frightened and trembling because she knew what had happened to her, and she fell at his feet and told him the whole truth. "My daughter," he said, "your faith has restored you to health; go in peace and be free from your complaint."
