Dear Parishioners and Friends

Every now and then I dip into one of the documents which Pope Francis has written during his pontificate. He provides much food for thought and contemplation. I share with you the following from Evangelii Gaudium, the Joy of the Gospel, paragraph 88.

The Gospel tells us constantly to run the risk of a face- to-face encounter with others, with their physical presence which challenges us, with their pain and their pleas, with their joy which infects us in our close and continuous interaction. True faith in the incarnate Son of God is inseparable from self-giving, from membership in the community, from service, from reconciliation with others. The Son of God, by becoming flesh, summoned us to the revolution of tenderness.

It is not easy living with others. Speaking for myself, I find it only too human to want to nurture others to do things as I want them and their particular characteristics become my irritations. What Pope Francis appears to be getting at is that we should accept others as they are, not as we want them to be. A lifelong battle??

Parish Office will be closed tomorrow, Monday 30 January.


Could you be a Deacon?


