This coming Sunday is the feast of St Benedict, who introduced a special way of reading the Bible to Europe in the 6th Century. The Wednesday Word Family Time is based on St Benedict's way of praying and seeks to help you listen, with love, to God and to each other.

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus sends out his friends on an urgent mission with the instruction to heal and to share his message with all who will listen.

Jesus wants us to listen closely to his words. Regularly listening to Jesus reminds us what's really important in life and how much we are loved by God. St Benedict reminds us, "Listen carefully to the Master's instructions."

Jesus summoned the Twelve and began to send them out in pairs giving them authority over the unclean spirits. And he instructed them to take nothing for the journey except a staff - no bread, no haversack, no coppers for their


purses. They were to wear sandals but, he added, "Do not take a spare tunic." And he said to them, "If you enter a house anywhere, stay there until you leave the district. And if any place does not welcome you and people refuse to listen to you, as you walk away shake off the dust from under your feet as a sign to them." So they set off to preach repentance, telling people to change their lives and turn back to God. And they cast out many unclean spirits, and anointed many sick people with oil and cured them.


Our Special Time Together

Jesus sent out his friends, the disciples, in pairs to tell the Good News of God. He told them to stay where they were made welcome. But if people did not listen to their message, they were to shake the dust off their feet as they left that house. So the disciples went out and started telling everyone to change their lives and to turn back to God, and they healed many people who were sick.

Jesus sent out his disciples to share his message with all who would listen. What did the disciples tell the people to do? Which words stood out for you in this Sunday's Gospel, and why? See the picture opposite. How does it make you feel? What does it make you think about?

Wednesday's LISTENING 3 **Loving God & Each Other**

Listening is a sign of real love - it's a powerful way of showing that we care. Listening to the right people and the right messages is important for us and for our children. Ask your child if they know someone who is a really good listener. Who does your child like to listen to? Do they know people who speak with kindness and love, and want good things for them and others? It may help your child if you give them an example of your own.
