Curriculum News

Reception This week in Reception we listened to the story Lost and Found. We discussed how the little boy and penguin travelled to the South Pole. The children investigated if different materials would float and sink. They then designed their own boats that would get them to the South Pole

Year 1 What a fantastic first week back we have had. We have started our English theme on 'Traditional Tales'. We came into our class to a mystery box filled with clues and found out that our traditional tale will be 'Rumpelstiltskin'. The children have loved reading this story and we can't wait to start practising performing our play next week. In maths this week we have started to use the base ren equipment to find the value of numbers to 20.

Year 2 . See Spotlight

Year 3 "What a first week back! We have begun the best topic in the world...Romans. Already the excitement is building in the class. Later this term we will be having our Roman day with a pitch battle on the field between Class 7 and Class 8. In PE we have started a topic on athletics - we learnt to time ourselves and start from a sprint (crouched start). In English we have started looking at non-chronological reports and how to convey information clearly. We can't wait for the rest of the term!"

Year 4 This week, Year 4 have been introduced to their new English novel 'A Race to the Frozen North - The Matthew Henson Story. This is linked to our umbrella topic - We Are Explorers. In Maths, the children have been focusing on telling the time. Our first athletics session was enjoyable and the skill that they learnt was 'Sprint start'.

Year 5 We haave begun our Explorers topic on Space by learning what Science Fiction is and listening and watching a range of Science Fiction texts and clips, in preparation for writing their own Science Fiction stories.

Year 6 A lovely few days back together in the new year! We were reunited with our buddies and took them on a winter walk looking out for signs and symbols of this season. We also began reading our class novel of The Wizard of Oz as well as looking at clips from the famous film. We're all looking forward to an exciting 2023 for the Year 6 children.

I hope that these past days of Christmas and New Year have brought many blessings for all of you. Even when things don't seem to have gone as we would have wished, the message we have heard is about persevering, not giving up, seeing the hand of the Lord guiding and holding us through all the joys and difficulties that life inevitably brings.

My own reflections in recent days have hovered around Our Blessed Lady giving birth to her Son in the most difficult of circumstances – homelessness, fatigue after a lengthy journey, fear at what might happen to her child, an army of occupation depriving Joseph and Mary of their freedom... The happy crib scenes only present one side of the story. Yet the message of the nativity is that, like Mary and Joseph, we place our trust in the God who disclosed himself to Moses in the burning bush as 'The One who is, who shall be, Yahweh'. Yes, though we celebrate the events of the past we recognize that the birth of the God-child all those years ago enables us to place our futures in God's hands with confidence. I pray that 2023 will be a time of great joy for all of us.

May I express my thanks to you all for your wonderful support and kindness not only at Christmas but throughout the year. I feel truly blessed to be your priest.

SHOP AND GIVE

Ormskirk Food Bank donations can be handed in at several shops and other businesses, in addition to their base at New Church House Ormskirk. They list:

Tesco Store, Burscough Bridge (Please note: this is for food bought in this store. Food purchased in other stores must be sealed and clearly labelled as having been purchased elsewhere). Also:

Booths, Ringtail Park, Burscough; Co-op, 52 Wigan Rd, Ormskirk; Co-op, 58 Town Green Ln, Aughton; Morrison's, 2 Park Rd, Ormskirk; Nationwide, Burscough Street, Ormskirk; Halifax, Church Street, Ormskirk; Kicking Donkey Pub, Narrow Moss Lane.

Other supermarkets are making their own contributions to the cost-of-living crisis. For example, Lidl labels items on shelves which can be placed in their collection point at the checkouts. These donations will be used "to help local community groups in need of supplies, including food banks, soup kitchens, community centres and more."

Parishioners wishing to donate food in any of the above ways should perhaps check arrangements first with individual stores.
