The 'Our World' topic is about ...

The children will learn about the four nations which make up the United Kingdom. They will explore the features of each nation, including their flag, capital city and traditional cuisine! Using atlases and maps, they will explore simple geographical features of these areas.

The children will explore key events in the past which have shaped the United Kingdom, including Remembrance Day and the life of the Queen.

What we already know...

- We live in Ormskirk.
- There are plants and living creatures in our world.

By the end of the topic we will know ...

Locational and Place Knowledge

Name and locate some places in their locality, the UK and wider world.

Human & physical geography

Use a range of sources such as simple maps, globes, atlases and images.

Know that symbols mean something on maps.

Geographical Skills: Fieldwork

Observe and describe daily weather patterns. Use simple fieldwork and observational skills when studying the geography of their school and its grounds.

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
Wider curriculum learning


We are going to read...
