'Prophecy and Promise'

"Loving God In All We Do."



The 'Prophecy and Promise' topic is about ...

understanding that God showed His love by sending Jesus, focusing on the story of Jesus' birth and Mary's role in saying "Yes" to God. Lessons will centre on the Gospel of St. Luke, teaching about angels, the Nativity, and connecting these to Advent traditions, while helping children appreciate the significance of the Christmas story.

Prior learning

The focus for Science is seasonal changes. Children will observe and describe changes throughout autumn as towards winter and be able to describe weather associated with the season and how day length and temperature varies.

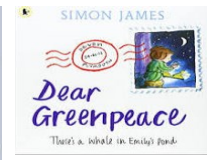
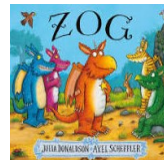
