


During the Autumn Term children in Year 2 focused on the history right on their doorstep, with a focus on Ormskirk. The pupils were able to learn about local landmarks and their significance and even created famous Ormskirk gingerbread men!

After a year of gratitude for our NHS, Year4 appropriately studied the history of this British institution. They heard firsthand accounts from people who remembered its creation and the ability to then get glasses and help with their teeth.

They also discussed how Aneurin Bevan's vision was different to how it eventually turned out.
