Children in Year 2 have been working hard to live out the mission of 'being kind to each other' by helping people in class and sharing their knowledge to help others in lessons and to give encouragement.




Our Year 6 Eco Warriors gave up their break times to sell cakes to the rest of school.






Year 6 comforted each other when they made spring rolls - some recipes were more successful than others!

Some animals came to visit us and when showed we could be trusted by being very gentle.




