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Curriculum News

Nursery We have been continuing to enjoy the story 'Zoo vet', the children all looked wonderful on World Book Day dressed as animals and vets. We have been creating 'tiger symmetry' and exploring colour mixing. We have been talking about how we would care for animals and what they may need to be happy and healthy, we have been sorting animals and talking about the different habitats that they like.

Reception This week in Reception we have continued our 'Animal Kingdom' theme. We also celebrated World Book Day, and dressed as different Jungle animals, we focused on tigers being the most important animal of all and did some symmetrical artwork with oil pastels. We have also continued practising our under arm throw in PE.

Year 1 What a busy and exciting week we have had in year 1. In English the children have been busy creating story maps ready to write their new story of No-Bot the Robot with their new chosen characters and setting. We really enjoyed celebrating World Book Day on Thursday with a focus on our animal 'Beavers'. The children made their own beavers collage, completed a fact file and made their own masks. Beavers are best!

Year 2 We have had a wonderful week in Year 2! This week our 'Animal Kingdom' curriculum theme has been inspired by our World Book Day book 'The Most Important Animal of All' by Penny Worms. The Year 2 children have been 'arguing' that krill are the most important animals because they provide food for many whales and sea creatures. They have learned how to create a food web about the krill, have created fantastic fact files, written such creative Kenning poems and used the dot art technique to make an under the sea painting. A true celebration of how much the children in Year 2 enjoy reading!

Year 3 "We had a great day finding out about bees and their importance to us - we did some great art work, which is now on the wall in the Hall. Thank you to the wonderful PTA for organising a great book swap - we were able to choose from a massive range of books. In English we have been writing more mystery stories, using ellipses, expanded noun phrases and a twist at the end. In rocks we have been studying their minerals and testing them. In ICT we were learning about coding angles of turns and drawing shapes - what a great week."

Year 4 "See Spotlight"

Year 5 have been enjoying learning about different animals to be found in the Amazon Rainforest, including bats, which have been our World Book Day focus. The children have begun to write creatively and use description and their growing knowledge of the Amazon Rainforest to develop ideas that will form their stories from another culture.

Year 6 For World Book Day this year our focus was on 'The Most Important Animal of All' and in particular the importance of elephants in our world. The children created wonderful diary entries from the perspective of an elephant ranger and a persuasive text about poaching. The children also created wonderful artwork linked to this topic. Year 6 also led the whole school Lent mass reverently in church.
