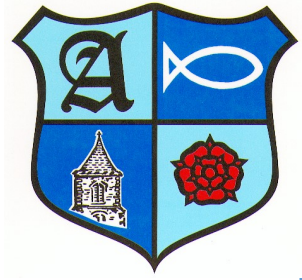

There was plenty of fun had by all along the way, with children enjoying kayak water fights and lakeside diving!

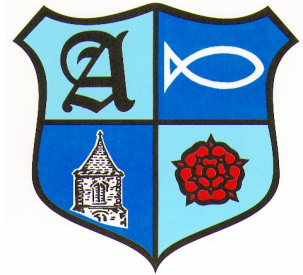


Immense support was shown towards each other throughout the week and relationships strengthened. Plenty of lifelong memories were created and pupils were a credit to our school – we are so proud of you children!

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Curriculum News

Nursery In Nursery this week we have been reading the story 'The hungry Caterpillar'. We have been furthering our knowledge on the lifecycle of butterflies. We have learnt a new song called 'Tiny caterpillar on a leaf' which we can all sing beautifully. We have talked about the food that the caterpillar eats in the story deciding which make us healthy and strong and which are yummy but don't make us healthy and strong! We followed this discussion up with making some healthy fruit kebabs, choosing our favourite fruits to make them. The children have learnt about symmetry, using loose parts and paint to create butterflies!

Reception This week we have had a focus on the story 'The Gingerbread Man'. The children have written about the Gingerbread Man, with some children writing the well-known Gingerbread Man phrase. We have also been learning about our immediate environments, we discussed Ormskirk, talked about the different places around Ormskirk and drew maps of Ormskirk. We have also continued our new RE topic on friends and discussed who Jesus friends we and how we can be good friends to others.

Year 1 What a busy first week we have had after half term. To kick start our week we started with our new English topic on 'Classic Poetry'. We looked at two famous poets, 'Robert Louis Stevenson' and 'Christina Rossetti' and compared them looking at the similarities and differences. In maths we have been busy learning all about 'Time'. The children have looked at different daily routines using language such as 'first, next, after that and finally. We have also began to learn how to tell the time to the hour. We can't wait for the next few weeks of fun together!

Year 2 Welcome back! It's hard to believe that we are in the final half term of this school year! The children have launched into their new theme - 'We are Creative' - reading the hilarious book 'The Day the Crayons Quit'. The children have done some wonderful work: reading letters with expression, using thesaurus' to uplevel adjectives, and giving opinions about the characters. In Maths they have been solving one and two step problems using their skills of addition and subtraction. The children have also started their new RE theme 'Rules' by making their own rule books. They have also been getting excited about the trip to the Philharmonic by listening to the music 'Summer' and being the conductor.

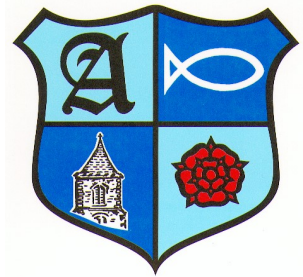

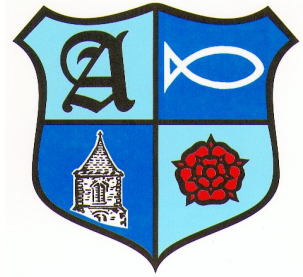
