Spotlight on Year 6

In Year 6 this week we have really enjoyed writing our books inspired by our World Book Day book 'Bees: A Honeyed History'. We focussed on the Beekeeper's equipment and learnt all about the way honey is made. The children have written either non-fiction texts, describing this process, or stories inspired by the pages studied. Careful attention was paid to creating the covers, ensuring that the same colour scheme was kept to.





Our next topic in English links to our novel: The Dancing Bear. We are debating the pros and cons of keeping animals in zoos. We have had a lot of lively debate and will be writing balanced arguments on the topic.



In Maths we have been working hard on a variety of worded and reasoning problems. We have also practised exam-type questions on mixed operations and decimal arithmetic.

Curriculum News

Nursery The children have been very busy this week caring for all the pets in the role play area, they have given them full check-up and have made sure they have had lots of love. The children have shown that they are ready to help care for our Ducklings that arrive on Tuesday next week, we are very excited. The children have been learning about all different types of pets and have been doing some wonderful alliteration work using the names of the pets, thinking of names that start with the same letter of the pet. It was very funny! The children have also been working hard with their sorting, counting and matching quantity and numeral whilst playing with the small pets. There has been some wonderful work shown from all the children. Stars of the week are: Silvie C, Ophelia W and Noah W

Reception This week we have been learning about the human lifecycle and the different life stages. We then focused on what we looked like as babies and toddlers and then compared these photos to how we look now and the things we could do at each of these stages. We have also learnt a song about the lifecycle of a caterpillar and have introduced different untuned instruments to match the actions/words to our song.

- **Year 1** We've had another super week in Year 1! We have continued our hard work on 'Fantasy Stories' and have now written and performed our very own story using our own characters and settings. We have our very own little authors on our hands. In maths we have started to learn all about the mass of objects using balance scales and cubes. Remember to always check our Twitter pages to see what we have been up to!
- Year 2 The children are continuing to enjoy our Spring term theme of 'Animal Kingdom.' They have been writing their own chapter of 'The Owl Who Was Afraid of the Dark' using adverbs, adjectives, time joining words and fantastic story language. They are little authors in the making! During their Maths sessions they have been learning how to add two 2-digit numbers when exchanging is needed. Well done children for persevering with this Maths challenge. Today is our visit to Farmer Ted's!! How exciting! The children are going to be learning about the lifecycles of different animals, as well as how they adapt to their habitats.
- **Year 3** A busy week in Year 3 finalising our poems and researching endangered animals! There's so much information to discover and understand! We also began our singing rehearsals for the Easter Play exciting!
- **Year 4** This week, Father Godric invited the Year 4 children to church. The children really enjoyed being back at church and they even completed one of their Holy Communion preparation booklets there.
- **Year 5** The Year 5 children have had an amazing week doing their Bikeability level 1 and 2. They have learnt how to check that their bike is safe to ride, practised riding while removing a hand to signal and manoeuvring around objects. They have then headed out onto the road and put all this into practise. Well done Year 5.
