The children have been very busy celebrating bonfire night in Nursery.

The children have talked about what they saw at the weekend:

"Bang, bang. I didn't like the bangs I was scared. I saw the best ones they was gold. I saw a bonfire, it was very big and there was a fence so you can't touch it, it was real".

The children talked about the senses they had used to describe what they had seen and heard, they also were able to distinguish their feelings and those of others and why they felt that way.



The children have made their own rockets using 2D shapes, naming the shapes they have used and using their knowledge of positional language to describe where they were putting the pieces to copy the image.

Curriculum News

Nursery See Spotlight

Reception This week in Reception we have been continuing to learn about People Who Help Us. We have had a visit from a Dentist and also Doctors. They talked to us all about their professions and showed us their equipment. In Literacy we completed our own fact-files on a chosen profession and in math's we have been exploring the properties of 2D shapes and have been sorting and grouping these accordingly.

Year 1 This week in Year 1 we enjoyed starting our Geography topic with a 'WOW'. The children came dressed up as one of the four countries from the United Kingdom. We learnt all about the capital cities as well as a few facts that the children learnt at home. The children have been brilliant innovating the ending to Zog and making it their own. They have made their own story map ready to write next week.

Year 2 This week we have been celebrating all that is Ormskirk! The children were amazing on Wednesday when they went on their trip - learning about the history of Ormskirk at the library, using sketching skills to draw the clock tower and creating maps of the park. We were very proud of the way that they represented our school! Back in school they have continued to develop their knowledge and skills by labelling aerial photos and creating a key for maps. Well done Year 2!

Year 3 This week, we have continued our studies of light, looking at reflective surfaces, learning what transparent, translucent and opaque mean and seeing how light travels. In English we have been retelling fables and we have identified Ormskirk on UK maps. In tennis we tried to rally with our partner and in Maths we have improved our column addition and subtraction. What a lot of learning!

Year 4 This week, the Year 4 children have been introduced to the History topic which is all about the Transatlantic Slave Trade. The children discussed this subject maturely and sensibly and are definitely ready to learn more. During the tennis sessions, the children learnt how to serve, throw a ball underarm and catch.

Year 5 The Year 5 children passed their Bikeability course today with flying colors! They listened carefully to their instructors all week and have all made fantastic progress. While out on the road in Ormskirk, local residents commented to the instructors on how polite and well behaved the children were. They have all been a credit to you, representing St. Anne's wonderfully. Well done to all the children!

Year 6 This week in Year 6 we have worked very hard and thoughtfully for our Remembrance Day assembly. The children created beautiful, thoughtful and emotive war poetry thinking of past conflicts as well as more recent and closer to home. They have also begun their topic of Tsunamis in Geography and continued work on Vocations in RE.
